Preface

History of Sports is as old as Humankind. The early history of sports often involved the preparation and training for war or hunting. Hence there were sports games that included throwing of Spears, stakes, and stones, and lots of play-fighting. Ancient Greece introduced formal sports, with the first Olympic Games in 776 BC.

I would like to quote Nelson Mandela here, "Sport has the power to change the world. It has the power to unite in a way that little else does. It speaks to youth in a language they understand. Sport can create hope where once there was only despair. It is more powerful than governments in breaking down racial barriers."

Science and Sports: General perception is that people pursuing and supporting science and scientists are confined to their labs. However, CSIR broke this myth long back; since its inception not only scientists of CSIR, but also technical and administrative staff have been active in various sports activities.

Everybody will agree that to organize events at Pan-CSIR level, a set of Rules/Guidelines is a must. After a rigorous exercise, first edition of "Sports Rules of SPB, CSIR" came into force in 2005. Subsequently Rules were modified incorporating some International guidelines and the revised Rules were released in 2014.

Taking cognizance of difficulties faced on grounds we are happy to bring out Revised Handbook on "Sports Rules of CSIR SPB," on the occasion of Golden Jubilee celebrations of the Shanti Swarup Bhatnagar Memorial Tournament (SSBMT). We are sure that CSIR sports fraternity will welcome these changes. Being Golden Jubilee year of SSBMT we have also introduced Women Cricket and Marathon.

I wish to put on record the fruitful discussions I had with Past Presidents, Prof. Anil Kumar Tripathi, Director, CSIR-Central Institute of Medicinal and Aromatic Plants, Lucknow and Dr. Virendra Mani Tiwari, Director, CSIR-National Geophysical Research Institute, Hyderabad, Former DG, CSIR, Dr. Girish Sahni with whom I got a chance to work for the welfare of the Sports Promotion Board.

I express my gratitude to Dr. Alok Dhawan, Director, CSIR-Indian Institute of Toxicology Research, Lucknow, President, CSIR-Sports Promotion Board for his guidance and support. The revised Handbook of Rules and regulations would not have been possible without the untiring efforts of Board Members, Dr. Sathravada Balaji, Dr. Shobhna Choudhary, Dr. Amit Chawla, Dr. K Krishnamurthi, Dr. Indu Bhushan Deb, Mr. C J Jagtap, Mr. K Chandran, Mr. T. CSIR-SPB

Sports activities are recognized as universal form of overall personality development. It is also a form of the great expressions of the aspirations of a person to excel. Appreciating the impact of employee recreation in the development of leadership qualities, interaction and communication skills that are essential in providing effective service delivery, organizing sports events and creating recreational environment have become an integral part of the personnel policy of CSIR.

Towards this objective, the early initiatives taken by a few of the CSIR Institutes/Laboratories specially those located in remote places like, Pilani, Bhavnagar, Karaikudi, Dhanbad, Jorhat, etc, to form staff clubs are highly laudable.

The Institutes/Laboratories set up their staff clubs, as soon as they were established. However, organizing sports events at the agency level in CSIR commenced only in 1953 with the initiative of the CSIR Headquarters when it hosted a tournament for the staff of Delhi-based laboratories. This 'limited sports activity' continued for three years which was elevated to an All India level tournament in 1955. In memory of the founder Director (now re-designated as Director General), Dr. Shanti Swarup Bhatnagar, the Tournament was named as the Shanti Swarup Bhatnagar Memorial Tournament (SSBMT) that enlarged the participation of all CSIR employees spread across the country. Initially, the tournaments were organized biannually having games such as Cricket, Volleyball, Tennis, Basketball, Table Tennis, Badminton, Chess, Carom and Bridge.

The responsibility was then shouldered by the CSIR Headquarters Staff Club that used to organize the tournament in CSIR laboratories over a period of 7 to 8 days, every alternate year. The SSBMT held at the National Physical Laboratory (NPL) in 1956 could be termed as the First All India CSIR Tournament.

Meanwhile, CSIR considered providing greater impetus to sports within the system. An official platform was accordingly provided by forming the CSIR Sports Control Board (SCB) on the lines of those existed in the Railways, P&T, etc. Formalization of the CSIR Sports Control Board took place in March, 1980 with its registration as a Society under the Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860. In view of the objectives/role of Sports Control Board, its nomenclature was changed to the Sports Promotion Board (SPB).

The SSBMT received overwhelming response with huge participation of around 1000 players and officials at one time. Some small Institutes/Laboratories with limited infrastructure experienced difficulties to host such mega events. It was therefore resolved to organize Zonals and Finals separately involving relatively lesser number of participants. All the 40 staff clubs were then clubbed to form four zones with the

participation of around 200 participants in each zone. Top two successful teams in individual and team events of each game from these four zones then meet during the Finals. After employing various permutations and combinations over a period of time, the SSBMT came into being in its present form i.e. being organized every year, alternately for indoor and outdoor games. The present practice thus provides greater incentive to the best eight players/teams every year as they get an opportunity to play twice (at two different venues for zonals and for finals) during the same year.

The CSIR-SPB, in addition to the above tournaments, also organizes certain specialized tournaments, such as: Nayuydamma Memorial Cricket Tournament, Atma Ram Memorial Volleyball Tournament; Thacker Memorial Lawn Tennis Tournament; Hussain Zaheer Bridge Tournament; Sidhu Memorial Table Tennis Tournament; A.P. Mitra Memorial Badminton Tournament; and Anusandhan Basket Ball Tournament (alternate years).

With a vision 'To catch them young' CSIR-SPB initiated recognizing the young sports talents by awarding stipends to the wards of CSIR employees who have excelled in various sports activities. These awards are given in following categories:

(Prizes for all the above categories are given in respective Institutes on the occasion of CSIR Foundation Day. Starting from 2017 a citation signed by President and Secretary of CSIR-Sports Promotion Board is also given to the wards along with cash prize)

CSIR-SPB, through respective institutes/ laboratories honour the players who would be retiring/superannuating in the year during the conduct of the Zonals/Finals or any other tournament hosted in recognition of their achievements in any of the sports events during their service in the CSIR Institute.

Necessary support is also provided to Institutes/ Laboratories to build/improve infrastructure related to sports and recreational activities.

CSIR-SPB is happy to announce that from date of release of this Revised Rules, CSIR employees who are willing to participate in National Level Marathon will be supported. CSIR-SPB will reimburse Registration charges. Participant has to display "CSIR" both in front and back of their "running gear" with logo during run.

Present constitution of SPB is: Eight members (based on nominations received from CSIR laboratories; Group-IV and III, Section officer or Under Secretary, Hindi Officer, Executive PS). DG, CSIR selects so as to have two members representing each of four zones i.e. North, South, East and West. The term of the Board Members is 3 Years.

The Handbook gives every detail of the tournaments, both for Indoor and Outdoor Games to be played in Zonals as well as in the Finals. Henceforth all tournaments will be played as per the following revised Rules.

- It is mandatory for All CSIR labs, and complexes, and CSIR Hqs. have to participate SSBMT tournaments.
- All Members (regular employees) and Associate Members (Students JRF/SRF/RA etc.) of their respective staff clubs shall only be allowed to participate in all the events being organized under tutelage of CSIR-SPB. Restrictions on Associate Members are:

- Associate Members must have completed at least six months as members of staff club.
- Regular employees who are becoming a staff club member just before the tournament may not be encouraged to take part in the SSBMT events and concerned staff club of the respective lab should take proper action.

- All participating teams in SSBMT would undergo Selection process, to be certified by COA/AO and approved by Directors. (Associate Members: Members of staff club including registered Ph.D. students working as Project staff, JRF/SRF, AcSIR, etc. any Govt. sponsored post-doctoral fellows such as RA's, CSIR Pool Scientists, QHFs NPDFs, DST Inspire/woman fellows, SERB-Ramanujan Fellows, DBT Ramalingaswami Fellow etc., are allowed to participate under the umbrella of Associate Members restricting the total numbers as mentioned above)
- The host institute shall make all arrangements pertaining to:
 - Venue(s)/ transport
 - Neutral Umpires/Referees Procurement of Prizes/Mementos, etc. and distribution of the same.
- Boarding and lodging arrangements for the participating teams are to be facilitated by the host Institute as per the directions of CSIR-SPB (Rs.300/- per day per player as subsidy from the CSIR-SPB) for the duration of the tournament.
- It is recommended that the host institute may consider providing accommodation at least one day before and after the tournament to the visiting teams.
- The host Institute shall submit the Utilization Certificate for the grant provided by CSIR-SPB within a period of 30 days of the conclusion of the Tournament. However, a detailed report on the conduct of the Tournament along with the certified score cards of all the events held to be forwarded to the Secretary, CSIR-SPB within a period of one week along with original photographs.
- To & fro expenses of the players to be borne by the concerned Institute.
- All Managers of the participating teams shall deposit matching grant [contributed by CSIR-SPB] their Institute's contribution for their respective participants to the host Institute during the Managers' Meet.
- Managers of the participating teams must bring Flag [3'×2'] as per SSBMT approved format of their respective Staff Clubs for display during the conduct of the SSBMT and other such Tournaments where the CSIR-SPB is being represented.
- In order to encourage participation of players in large numbers, it has been decided that no male player shall be permitted to participate in more than one event both in outdoor and indoor events of SSBMT.
- However, in view of minimal representation of women players in sporting events, it has been decided that only women players shall be permitted to participate in more than one event (but limited to a maximum of two events)

- at the **Zonal levels only without causing any hindrance to the organizers** in the conduct of matches as per the schedule finalized by them.
- In the event of any women player or women team qualifying in more than one
 event at the zone level, the concerned Team Manager, in consultation with
 the players (and the Secretary of the respective Staff Club, wherever
 necessary), is required to identify the event in which their team will
 participate in the Finals, so that teams placed next in the order of merit
 shall have the opportunity to join the Finals.
- While participation of players shall be restricted to the specified number indicated by the CSIR-SPB for each event, it is to be borne in mind that such player participating in the individual event shall necessarily be a player in the team event also.
- The players participated in an individual event in the Zonal and qualified to participate in the Finals shall only participate in such events in the Finals; Results of Zonals must contain list of players with ID no. and Members status. Any misrepresentation shall summarily disqualify the team from participating in the event.
- Substituting any player in the Finals shall be permitted only in Team events
 under exceptional circumstances e.g. a player is not able to participate on
 medical grounds. Further a player qualified in an Individual event in the Zonal
 tournament shall only participate in the Finals and under no circumstances
 he/she shall be replaced by any other player. In such a case, the concerned
 Staff Club shall stand to lose its chance to represent/participate in that
 Individual event.
- In case an individual, as a part of team qualified in a Zonal, is unable to participate the Finals (strictly on medical grounds/any other genuine reasons which will be decided by the Secretary, CSIR Sports Promotion Board on the recommendation of the Director of the Concerned Institute), replacement may be permitted. Any such request for replacement will be considered by the Secretary, CSIR Sports Promotion Board if it is forwarded through the Director of the concerned Institute backed with requisite Medical certificates etc.
- Any person who has not participated in Zonal will not be allowed in Finals unless replacing someone on Medical Grounds.
- Any team present after arriving in the host Institute, but does not participate in
 designated tournaments will come under **Misconduct** and will be viewed
 seriously. It must be brought to the notice of the Director (ex-officio President
 of the Club) of the concerned Institute. SPB Observers will report the matter to
 the Secretary, CSIR Sports Promotion Board who may recommend the Director

- of the concerned Institute to recover the TA/DA already paid to such players. The Team may be disqualified from participation in at least one tournament.
- All the teams are expected to reach the Tournament venue, a day before the start of the tournament.
- Group formation shall be done in the presence of Team Managers during the Managers' meet, through draw of lot System. A minimum of 50% presence of Managers of the total participating teams shall form the quorum. Umpires/ Referees, as far as possible may be present during Managers' Meet. Managers will apprise Umpires/Referees to ensure compliance.
- Once the Draw is finalized, no request for change of Draw such as change of venue/time, etc. shall be entertained.
- All the teams are requested to kindly declare their team members before commencement of respective games. The Managers of the teams shall verify the credentials of the players of their opposite teams and authenticate with their signatures.
- Players shall wear proper kit/dress while playing. All the Team Managers shall
 ensure that the participants are present in proper kit. Indiscipline would be
 seriously viewed and would lead to disqualification of the individual/team from
 further playing. Decision of the Umpires/Referees will be final.
- Participating teams are required to maintain decorum during the conduct of the
 Tournaments and honour the decision of the Umpires/Referees. In case of any
 dispute, the matter shall be referred in writing through the manager of the
 concerned team to the **Disputes Resolution Committee** (DRC) set up by the
 host Institute which will also have the SPB Observers as Members of the
 Committee. In all such matters, the decision of the DRC shall be final.
- The CSIR Teams with Coach/Manager will be selected by CSIR-SPB on the basis of their performances during Zonals/Finals of the SSBMT conducted during that period.

SHANTI SWARUP BHATNAGAR MEMORIAL TOURNAMENT (SSBMT)

One of the doyens of Science in India, Sir Dr. Shanti Swarup Bhatnagar (1894-1955), was the First Director Board of Scientific and Industrial Research (now redesignated as Director General) of the Council of Scientific & Industrial Research (CSIR). He was also the first Chairman of the University Grants Commission (UGC). In 1936, Dr. Bhatnagar was rewarded with the Order of British Empire for his contribution to pure and applied chemistry. In 1943, the Society of Chemical Industry, London, elected Dr. Bhatnagar as its Honorary Member and later as its Vice-President. In 1943, he was elected the Fellow of Royal Society.

It was his dynamism and farsightedness that was responsible for the growth and development of not only the CSIR but also the level of Science & Technology in India. His untiring efforts, devotion to duty and pioneering work in the field of Chemical Sciences brought him many laurels from India and abroad. He emphasized on the utilization of science for national development and thus was a great builder of this important organization.

The SSBMT is a novel way of paying tribute to this great personality and has been a forum for bringing together staff members of CSIR irrespective of discipline and organizational hierarchy. What started and progressed as a biennial event has now grown magnificently to outdoor and indoor tournaments held in alternative years in different national laboratory premises.

Winning Team will get 2 points and in case of Tie, two teams will get 1 point each.

Thereafter, the teams are evaluated on the basis of points, net run rates, etc., and ranking will be given. In case of tie even in the net run rate, the team which won against the other team will be given advantage.

Top two teams from each group will qualify for the Zonal qualifying final round matches.

A match will be 'Best of Three' on rotation basis of 25 points with a minimum of two-point advantage.

If both the teams are on tie with one game each, the third and deciding game will be of 15 points with a minimum of two-point advantage.

Winning Team will get 2 points.

In case of teams sharing equal points in the league phase, the **net score** of total number of sets won and lost will be taken into consideration. In case of a tie, the **net score** of the number of points scored and lost in each set will be the deciding factor.

In case top two teams in each group get equal points, the maximum games won in the league matches will be considered to determine group 1^{st} and 2^{nd} position for the qualifier final Round.

In case top two teams win equal no. of games, the maximum points scored in the league games will be considered to determine the group 1st and 2nd position for the qualifier final Round.

In case of a tie there also, the Tournament Referee in presence of SPB observers will arrive at a decision which would be final and binding on all the teams.

Zonal Qualifying Final Round (Knock-out basis)

Top two resultant teams from each Group will play in criss-cross format - 1st (Group-A) plays with 2nd (Group-B) and 1st (Group-A) plays against 2nd (Group-B); both the winning players/teams will qualify for the SSBMT Finals event.

General Guidelines

- Selection & invitation to S&T related Department to be managed by the host Institute.
- Associate Members are not allowed in Invitational Tournaments.
- Semifinals knock out matches of Zonals and Finals should be play as in criss-cross format.
- All teams have to bring their own kit and playing equipment e.g. bat, pad, batting and wicket gloves, racket and proper sportswear, etc.
- Host Institute has to make local arrangements like grounds, match official's umpires and boarding and lodging of players of outstation teams.
- Arrangements of boarding & lodging, transport and accommodation to be made by the host Institutes as per the instructions of CSIR-SPB for the duration of the tournament.
- CSIR-SPB to provide the sports Uniform to the CSIR Teams.
- Administrative Officer/Heads to certify eligibility of selected players and to formally forward the same to the host club. The organizing committee of the host club may ask for the identity cards of participants.
